FRUITS

Judge – Mr. J. Uren

1. **10 Raspberries** - complete with stalks and arranged on a plate
2. **25 Blackcurrants** - complete with stalks and arranged on a plate
3. **10 Gooseberries** – complete with stalks and arranged on a plate
4. **3 Strings of Redcurrants** – arranged on a plate
5. **10 Cherries** – complete with stalks and arranged on a plate
6. **Plate of any other fruit** – one kind

VEGETABLES Judge – Mr. J. Uren

7. **5 Pods of Peas** – one variety
8. **5 Pods of Broad Beans** – one variety
9. **3 Onions** – one variety with tops
10. **1 Lettuce** – any variety with root wrapped in foil or cling-film
11. **3 Carrots** – one variety with tops
12. **3 Beetroot** – one variety with tops
13. **3 Potatoes** – one variety
14. **5 Mange Tout** – one variety
15. **3 Rhubarb Sticks** – pulled and with leaves trimmed to 10cms
16. **Plate of any other Vegetables** – one kind
17. **A box of assorted garden produce** – size 45 x 60cms

FLOWERS Judges – Mr. J. Uren

Classes 27 to 31 inclusive must be own grown or have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least six months

18. **One Tea Rose in a Vase** – any variety
19. **Floribunda Rose** – one spray
20. **Most Fragrant Rose** – one bloom, max. height 25cm inc. vase
21. **Most Fragrant Sweet Pea** – one stem, max height 25 cm inc. vase
22. **Most Fragrant Flower** – one stem, max height 25cm inc. vase
23. **5 Sweet Pea Stems** – any variety
24. **6 Flower Heads** – one variety, display trays available
25. **Vase of Flowers** – any variety
26. **Single Stem from a Shrub** – any variety, can be in flower
27. **1 Flowering Pot Plant** – Begonia, Fuchsia etc – 30cm max pot
28. **1 Foliage Pot Plant** – Ivy, Spider etc – 30cm max pot
29. **Small Floral Hanging Basket** – 30cm max basket: basket to be displayed supported on a plant pot
30. **Pot of Herbs** – single or mixed variety – 30cm max pot
31. **1 Cactus or Succulent Pot Plant** – 30cm max pot

FLOWER ARRANGEMENTS Judge – Mrs. N. Preece

32. **An arrangement incorporating a candlestick**
NOVICE CLASS – *this class is open to any person who has not won a prize in any flower arranging class at Keyworth Show*
33. **An arrangement in a glass bottle**
34. **Miniature Class** – an arrangement in a bottle top. Space 10cm x 10cm x 10cm
35. **Petite Class** – an arrangement in a wine glass. Space 23cm x 23cm x 23cm

COOKERY

Judge – Mrs. J. Francis

Use recipes printed in the schedule; butter or margarine may be used. All entries (including young people's classes) must be displayed on white paper plates, white doilies may be used, no other accessories. Paper plates and doilies will be available in the marquee.

PRESERVES Judge – Mrs. J. Francis

Wax discs and cellophane cover only – jars to be not more than 500 gms.

- 44. 1 Jar Jam – any soft fruit
- 45. 1 Jar Jam – any stoned fruit
- 46. 1 Jar Jelly
- 47. 1 Jar Marmalade – any citrus fruit[s]
- 48. 1 Jar Lemon Curd/Cheese
- 49. 1 Jar Beetroot & Ginger Chutney – see printed recipe
- 50. 1 Jar of any other Chutney or Pickle

WINES Judge – Mrs. K. Norman

All wines must be made using the process of fermentation; tinned juice may be used; fortification is not allowed. Wine to be shown in 75cls colourless glass wine bottles; 1 – 2cms air space to be left between wine and cork stopper; **label to be fixed centrally on bottles stating class number and description of contents.**

- 51. 1 Bottle Dry White Wine
- 52. 1 Bottle Sweet or Medium White Wine
- 53. 1 Bottle Dry Red Wine
- 54. 1 Bottle Sweet or Medium Red Wine

BEER Judge – Mrs. K. Norman

- 55. 1 Bottle Beer – Mild, Bitter or Lager

PHOTOGRAPHY Judge – Mr. R. Rowe ARPS

Must have been taken in the last 2 years and not shown at Keyworth Show before; colour or b/w prints; commercial processing and digital photography accepted. **Class number to be attached to entry.**

- 56. 1 Snapshot – any subject; up to 18 x 13cms, unmounted. *This class open only to competitors who are **NOT** members of a Photographic Society or Club.*
- 57. 1 Amusing Snapshot with Caption – up to 18 x 13cms on an A5 mount - judged equally on humour and technical merit
- 58. 2 Complementary Snapshots of “Old and Young” – up to 18 x 13cms each; snapshots both mounted onto one A4 mount
- 59. 1 Digitally Manipulated Picture/Image – max A4 size including any mount
- 60. 1 Mounted Photograph – max 25 x 20cms print on a max 30 x 25cms mount

PICTURES Judge – Mr. K. Barton

Must not have been entered into Keyworth Show before; framed or unframed, mounted or unmounted.

Class number to be attached to painting; the maximum painted size is to be 60 x 45cms [A2]

- 61. **Novices Class: 1 Painting** – using any medium. *This class is open to any person who has not won a prize in any Picture Class*
- 62. 1 Portrait Painting – using any medium
- 63. 1 Landscape Painting – using any medium
- 64. 1 Still Life Painting – using any medium
- 65. 1 Abstract Painting – using any medium

NEEDLECRAFT Judge – Mrs. S. Weaver

Must not have been entered into Keyworth Show before; judged on technical merit and originality; state on entry form whether kit or original. **Class number to be attached to entry.**

- 66. A Piece of Hand Embroidery
- 67. A Piece of Hand Cross Stitch
- 68. A Piece of Patchwork or Quilting
- 69. A Piece of Hand Knitting or Crochet
- 70. A Piece of Any Other Needlecraft
- 71. **Novice Class – a piece of Any Needlecraft**
This class is open to any person who has not won a prize in this section
- 72. **A piece of Needlecraft**
An open class for young people between the ages of 11 and 18

CRAFTWORK SECTION Judge – Mr. R. Preece

- 73. **A Piece of Woodwork or Woodcraft** – joinery, furniture, carving, turning, etc.
- 74. **Any Other Craftwork** – metal, plastic, jewellery, basketry, beading etc.
- 75. **A piece of Craftwork**
An open class for young people between the ages of 11 and 18

YOUNG PEOPLES SECTION Judges – Mr. K. Barton, Mr. R. Rowe, Mrs. J. Francis; Mrs. N. Preece

Classes 76-88 are for work produced outside school and must be the sole work of the child.

Under 6 years of age

- 76. **Make an edible necklace**
- 77. **Photography Class** – a snapshot up to 18 x 13cms
- 78. **3 Painted Biscuits** – see printed recipe

Age 6-8 years

- 79. **Make a card for a friend** on a folded piece of A4 card using recycled bits & pieces eg. Sweet papers, foil, wool, beads, stickers etc
- 80. **Photography Class** – a snapshot up to 18 x 13cms
- 81. **3 Smartie Cookies** – see printed recipe

Age 9 – 12 years

- 82. **Make and decorate a pen/pencil holder** using unwanted bits & pieces
- 83. **Photography Class** – a snapshot up to 18 x 13cms
- 84. **3 Apple Rolls** – see printed recipe

YOUNG PEOPLES OPEN CLASSES – any age up to 12 years

- 85. **A Model of your own choice made from any construction kit components** – eg. Lego, Meccano, K'Nex, Magnetix, etc.; no dimension to exceed 30cms
- 86. **Miniature Garden in a Tray** – tray can be round or rectangular; maximum tray dimension to be 30cms
- 87. **Produce a design for a public flowerbed for the 2012 Olympics incorporating the Olympic rings.**
- 88. **A Flower Arrangement in a yoghurt pot**

INFANT AND JUNIOR SCHOOLS SECTION Judge – Mr. K. Barton

Classes 89 - 92 are for work produced inside school and must be the sole work of the child. Separate rules apply which are provided to the schools.

- 89. **Reception Year** – A picture or collage of a wiggly snake
- 90. **Years 1 & 2** – A collage of a fearsome monster using recycling bits & pieces
- 91. **Years 3 & 4** – Design a poster to encourage recycling
- 92. **Years 5 & 6** – Design an eco-house
